
A year filled with hardship— and so much love.

EAST AFRICA – 2020

Nutritional Feeding Program (for the severely malnourished)

 You served 142,668 people, including over 23,884 severely malnourished children, a total of 11,202,480 meals (1,318,363 pounds).

Pediatric Medical Clinics

• You treated **56,654** patients.

Children Support Programs

- In addition to feeding malnourished children, you supported **122** other children:
 - 73 from the community
 - 31 from the Children's Home
 - 18 from your Refuge Homes

Refuge Home (for Sex Trafficking Victims in the Red Light District)

- You provided a safe and loving home for 32 girls and their children.
- You assisted 20 girls through your Phase 2 Transition Program and 52 girls through other community-based programs.

Mercy Chapel (a vocational center for girls in the Red Light District)

- You Provided a vocational education to 105 girls.
- Due to COVID, the Vocational Center was closed. However, in spite of the shutdown, **51** girls were able to graduate.
- In response to this, these same girls stepped in and made 15,608 masks, 8,200 hygiene packs and medical garments to help those suffering from this dreadful disease. Within weeks of starting this initiative, they were recognized by the East Africa government and given permission to distribute their handmade crafts through the region.

UNITED STATES – 2020

US Safe Program (for Sex Trafficking Victims)

- You provided a safe and loving home for **11** girls through the US Refuge Home this year.
- Through your joint venture with local police stations you provided intervention to 457 women and children, keeping them from becoming victims of trafficking and/or further sexual abuse.

Love & Care Center

- Through your "Community Helping Community" Initiative that started in Response to COVID, you provided 141,710 people, (35,218 families and 79,394 children) with 797,294 pounds of food.
- This is in addition to the 4,205 people served through our regular program prior to COVID.
- You provided 208 children with coats and gave backpacks to 75 children in need.
- Your Community Helping Community Initiative has over 32 partners for "feet on the ground" distribution and serve an average of 4,000 families each month.

Volunteer Hours

• 267 Volunteers representing 3,375.75 hours – all done within the confines of COVID mandates.

In addition to serving over **142,000** hungry and malnourished people in East Africa,you've also heped expand the Community Helping Community (CHC) program, our response to the impact of COVID. While we used to provide food to **400** families each month, that number has exploded to **4,000** families each month over this past year!

Wrapping girls in a blanket of love and faith

A group of amazing women have been making bright and cozy tie blankets for a number of years to give to women and girls residing at the U.S. Refuge. **These blankets provide a sense of safety and comfort** to girls who have escaped the horrific and violent world of sex-trafficking.

The blankets are also used in Crisis Aid's advocacy offices located at two police departments in St. Louis. The blankets offer a practical purpose of covering victims who may not have adequate clothing. However, they provide so much more than that.

The blankets bring a smile to almost everyone who receives one. During what is usually a very

frightening and anxious time, they not only warm these ladies physically but help to create a warm and supportive space where they feel comfortable and safe speaking about the abuse they've endured. Many of these girls do not have a lot of personal items, so it becomes very special and meaningful to receive something they can call their own.



Thank you for providing crisis Intervention support to 457 women and children in St. Louis this year.

"I joined the Crisis Aid Safe Home in 2008. During my stay I learned about different kinds of professions, such as hairdressing, silk printing and sewing. I also had access to computer classes, vocational training and personal counselling, where I finally learned to be confident in myself.

After finishing school, I opened a mini hair salon. Today I am doing so well and even helping my biological family with expenses! I can't write in words all the things which I received from the Safe Home. More than any other thing, knowing God and becoming his child is great.
